A workshop about Suicide In Children



THIS WORKSHOP PROVIDES
INFORMATION AND INTERVENTIONS TARGETED
SPECIFICALLY TO CHILDREN AGE TWELVE OR YOUNGER.

Suicidal behavior in children age 12 or younger is a subject of growing concern for those who work with children. Suicidal thoughts and attempts in children have sometimes been overlooked, denied or ignored.

This workshop provides information and offers practical approaches for those working with children who are 12 years old or younger and who may be at risk of suicide. Intervention approaches build on the skills taught in the Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) as it applies to children.

"Tattered Teddies" Workshop is an interactive half-day workshop that includes group discussions, mini lectures and case studies.

- » A child's developing concept of death
- » Protective and risk factors
- » Communicating with children about suicide
- » Warning signs
- » Basic crisis intervention
- » Legal requirements
- » Resources including a 40 page resource and support workbook
